The Housing Authority of the County of San Joaquin announced to its Board of Commissioners that a three (3) year grant in the amount of \$412,470.00 was awarded to the Housing Authority. The Authority will partner with its non-profit subsidiary, Villa Real, Inc., to provide services to Public Housing residents living in the county. Gillian Murphy, Chairperson for Villa Real, Inc., and Director for Northeastern California Small Business Development Center of San Joaquin Delta College, was very happy with the grant awarded. and stated, "This grant will allow Villa Real to continue its important work of home ownership and economic self sufficiency in our community resulting in job creation and retention."

The Resident Opportunity & Supportive Services ("ROSS") Public Housing Service Coordinator Program, which awarded only \$1.4 million to the State of California, provides funds to hire local coordinators who will assess and then provide supportive services, including training and mentoring programs, to enable persons with disabilities and senior residents in San Joaquin County to live independently. The services offered through this grant will assist public housing residents in their endeavor to find jobs, start small businesses and survive in a difficult economic climate. This program is consistent with the Housing Authority's long-term strategic plan to bolster supportive services, jobs, and economic development in the community. The Authority's Plan currently has the following supportive services already in place: Family Self-Sufficiency program; a home-ownership program; a Senior Service Coordinator program; the agency's community liaison; and a myriad of community partnerships including a Scholarship Foundation, Youth Programming, and an employment internship program. Rudy Willey, Chairperson of the Housing Authority of the County of San Joaquin Board of Commissioners, added that, "In this economy, no matter which way we turn, we find people in need of help. This grant will allow us to better serve the community."

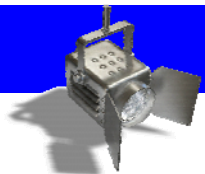

Resident Recipe

The following recipe is a family favorite of Ms. Calderon's. Enjoy!!

Chicken Mole

|----------------------------------|----------------------------------|
| 1 whole chicken, cut up | 2 fried corn tortillas |
| 1 can chicken broth | 3 pieces of garlic (medium size) |
| ½ lb. of chilies el negro | ½ of onion, chopped |
| ½ lb of chile pasilla | Clavos (whole cloves, optional) |
| ¼ cup of ajonjoli (sesame seeds) | Pepper to taste |
| ¼ cup of pumpkin seeds | |
| 6 almonds | |

Boil chicken first. Clean the chilies and take all the seeds out, then fry the chilies in oil and use the chicken broth (1 1/2 cups) to soak the chilies until they get soft. Use ¼ cup of ajonjoli and ¼ cup of pumpkin seeds and fry them. Make sure to fry pumpkin seeds and ajonjoli separately. Then, get the onion and fry it in a pan with oil or lard/your choice. After everything is fried you will blend: pumpkin seeds, almonds, tortillas, garlic, onion, clavos (not chilies) pepper, ajonjoli – everything gets blended (including chicken broth). Get a pan and put oil in it and fry a half onion on both sides then put spices into the pan, leave for 15 mins. During the 15 mins. make sure you are moving the onion and spices. As soon as it starts boiling add the chilies with chicken broth. Make sure to constantly stir around and in, 30 mins. it will be done. Serve mole over chicken with rice, or combine chicken with mole.
